 programme in Cambodia started in 2007 and is
 part of our integrated nutrition approach to
 achieve sustainable well-being for 5 million
 girls and boys in Cambodia.
- Supported by the World Food Programme, UNICEF, Procter & Gamble (P&G), MOFA Japan and World Vision offices in Korea, Taiwan and the United States of America.

PROGRAMME GOAL

Improved child well-being by increasing the number of children who are healthy and well-nourished with access to safe water, sanitation and hygiene in financially stable homes.

OUTCOMES

Improved Water, Sanitation and Hygiene behaviours through behaviour change programmes and appropriate WASH infrastructures

OUTPUTS:

- Health Centres (HC) have appropriate WASH infrastructure for clean deliveries to prevent the spread of infections
- Households have access to latrines for defecation
- Increased access to handwashing facilities for mothers and caregivers

- 5. WASH during emergencies is strengthened








KEY ACHIEVEMENTS October 2018 - September 2023
